THE STATE OF CONNECTICUT

Department of Public Health requires that all children who attend day care be

immunized. This includes their annual flu shot. CT State Day Care Licensing Regulation mandates that a complete and



current health assessment record be in your child's day care file.

This means that a new Early Childhood Health Assessment Record form must be filled out and turned in to us each time your child visits the doctor for his/her wellness visits/physicals. You can find this form on our website www.scottyskiddykorner.com under the Parent Korner tab.



OUTDOOR PLAY: It is important that the children have the proper clothing for outdoor play. Each child must have sneakers or

winter boots, gloves/mittens, a coat and hat. When there is snow on the ground, boots and snow pants are required. Children will not be allowed to play outside if they cannot be properly dressed.

Outdoor Temperature Policy

We will be able to enjoy outdoor play when the temperature is between 30' and 85' Fahrenheit. For cold temperatures we will factor in wind chill and for hot temperatures we will factor in the heat index. For temperatures in the lower and upper ranges of our policy we will adjust play times and hydration requirements.



Outdoor play may be cancelled when inclement weather conditions are forecast.

What is Process Art?

Do you ever look at your child's artwork and wonder, what exactly am I looking at? Didn't the calendar say "Musical Fingerpainting"? This is what we call Process Art.

So what is Process Art? By definition, process art emphasizes the act and process of making art over the product produced. It is open-ended, self-motivated and based on experience and experimenting. Characteristics of process art include:

- No specific outcome
- No step-by-step directions
- No sample for children to follow
- Work is entirely of the children's own choice, both in product and whether or not to participate.

True process art is simply allowing children a range of materials to use and allowing them to create at their own cares and whims. Ideas for inspiration can be posted, however process art is not about the outcome, but rather the intent of the creator.

So why is process art important for toddlers and preschoolers? The National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) touts Process Art as highly developmentally appropriate for the toddler and preschool classrooms. Some benefits of process art includes:

- Nurturing social and emotional health
- Reinforcing skills like focus, relaxation and emotional sharing
- Inspiring creativity and problem solving
- Builds cognitive skills like comparison, planning and problem solving
- Encourages vocabulary development and verbal expression of language

So what may seem like a jumbled mess to you is actually guite crucial in the development of your child.
