SUMMER WEATHER means warm days and abundant sunshine and the children will be spending more time outside. It is important to continue to provide weather appropriate clothing for your child's outdoor play. Each child should come with sneakers. Children will not be permitted to participate in outdoor play unless they have sneakers. Each child should also have a water bottle which we will keep filled with fresh water and they will be encouraged to drink often to stay hydrated. Also, to protect the children from the increased exposure to the sun during our outdoor play, we have given each family a new Topical Medication Form for 2025 that needs to be filled out, signed and returned for us to have on file so that your child can have sunscreen applied here at Scotty's. Once you have filled out and signed the form, return it to your child's teacher along with a bottle of new sunscreen, labeled with your child's name, so we can protect them during outdoor play.

OUTDOOR PLAY

Summer weather means more fun in the sun during our outdoor playtimes. To help protect the children during their playtime outdoors, we apply the sunscreen you have provided to protect them from the sun's rays. We monitor the temperature and humidity to make sure that exposure to each is kept within safe amounts of time. Water is available at all times and the children are encouraged to drink during and after each playtime. Safety is always on our minds so

that each outdoor experience is fun and safe.



Need an extra pair of helping hands? Look no further than your little one. Here are ways you can build on his eagerness to help out and teach him skills for the future

Say yes. When your youngster asks to let him help you, let him, even if you think the job is too hard for him. Just look for a small part he can tackle. Maybe he could shake pillows out of pillowcases when you're changing the sheets, for example.

Be patient. Allow your child to work at his own pace. Sure, it might take a little longer for him to load all the bowls into the dishwasher. But the sense accomplishment he'll feel is worth a few extra minutes.

Offer a hand. If you notice your youngster struggling, ask if he needs help rather than take over. But be prepared to let him work things out on his own if he turns you down.

Praise effort. Thank your child for his help, and point out how he makes a difference. ("We got the towels folded a lot faster, thanks to your hard work!") You'll make him feel proud and motivate him to keep helping.



If you would like someone other than you (the parent or guardian) to pick up your child, we ask that you please have a 'Permission for Pick Up of

Child by a Responsible Adult Other Than the Parent/Guardian' slip filled out for each person. This helps us make sure your child is never released to someone who is not authorized by you. That person will then have to ring our doorbell, be identified, have their license checked and copied, and then be verified they are allowed to pick up your child that day.

You can ask your child's teacher for this form, or you can also find them ready to print on our website under the 'Parents Korner' tab.
